



Vice President Faye Spencer's Report

The 2020 KAFCE State Tabulated Data and Summary of the Education Programs was submitted to NAFCE. The state wide totals were Number of FCE Presenters 473; Number of FCE Volunteer Hours 14,121; Number of FCE Members Reached 2,709; Money spent on lessons/community service \$10,885.12; Number of Non-Members Reached (& Media/Display/Booth) 159,653. For the 2020 program year, Kansas had 43 of 105 counties with members (36 with County Councils); there were 82 FCE Units with membership of 759; Independent members totaled 60.

<u>2022 Education Year-</u> the forms and lessons have been written and printed. Soon to be distributed for the State EPC Leadership Training on August 30 via a Zoom meeting. I submitted my application for NAFCE Program Coordinator, two-year term.

- **<u>Disbanded FCEs</u>— FCE members need to be notified 60 days before a vote is taken to disband an FCE. The voting should be 2/3rd of the vote to disband. A letter should be written to the KAFCE President Nancy Kernick, KAFCE Treasurer/Registrar DeLores Walden, Area Director, and County President that the FCE has decided to disband. The letter should include the disband date and, if there is money, how it was dispersed or the money should be forwarded to the KAFCE Treasurer. All books and awards need to be passed on to the KAFCE President or KAFCE Registrar so that the material can be taken to the K-State Archives.
- ** <u>Death of a KAFCE Member</u> County FCE President is to use a reporting form or provide information to KAFCE President Nancy Kernick, and KAFCE Treasurer DeLores Walden that includes name of member, date passed away, list area, county and name of FCE and who is reporting the death. The obituary should be included.


